- 01 **Mocho Banco stool** *ClassiCon*
Crafted from eucalyptus in 1954 by Brazilian designer, Sergio Rodrigues, it has a grip-hole in the seat, which means you can take it anywhere. classicon.com
- 02 **Ceramic tableware** *Adónde*
French firm Adónde's ceramic bowls, pitchers and vases are a favourite of chefs around the world. The pieces can be mixed and matched and piled as high as you like. adonde.fr
- 03 **Wall clock** *Hublot*
